CLUB MATTERSThe Glorious First of June 2022

It was a good few years ago when I last used this famous English naval victory in 1794 to indulge in a bit of jingoism. It may be a bit off to bash our continental neighbours when there is war in Europe but a bit of flag waving might be forgiven at this lovely Jubilee time. If you recall Admiral Howe duffed up the French Revolutionary Navy in the Bay of Biscay although, as with most sea battles, the outcome wasn't wholly conclusive. This also applied to The Battle of Sole Bay which we are entitled to celebrate 350 years after we duffed up the Dutch (sorry Coen) off the Suffolk coast near Southwold.
